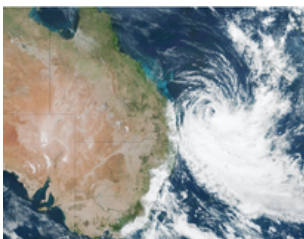

Cyclone Alfred has now gone.



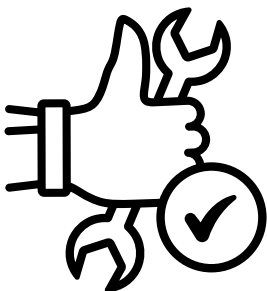
You may have heard some loud noises that were a bit scary, this is gone now.

Stay away from the water, it's not safe.

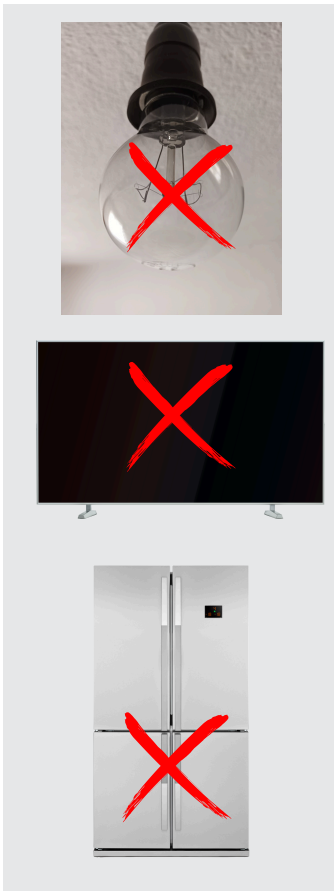


It's ok. The water will go away soon.



You might have no power.

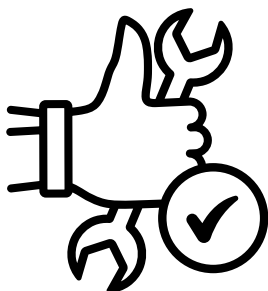
This means things that use electricity will not work like:



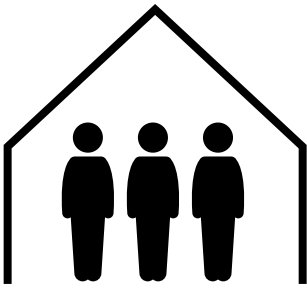
- Lights

- play cards



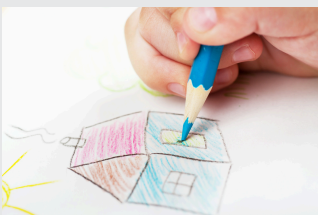
- listen to music
