Employment opportunities are a critical part of an inclusive, empowering community for people with disability.

We have a range of work and training options designed to help you reach your goals and find a job you love.

Work experience

For all school leavers, transitioning to work is a big step. Our work experience program is a great way to develop skills, make new friends and get job ready. In partnership with your school, we'll put together a tailored program that's right for you. This means you'll experience a range of work tasks, learn new skills and get job ready before you leave school. You'll also be supported and guided by mentors and supervisors in a safe environment.

With us, you can:

- Gain experience in a real-life work environment
- Learn about team work and communication skills
- Build your confidence and self-esteem
- Meet new people and make new friends
- Develop your skills and learn new ones
- Work towards finding a job you love

At the end of the program, you'll receive a Certificate of Achievement and a letter of work experience confirmation. If it's what you want, you may even get a job with us.

Supported employment

We offer supported employment opportunities through our Endeavour Foundation Social Enterprise sites, where you'll have the opportunity to gain new skills, feel part of a team and earn an income. If you're aged 16 or older, you could work in a commercial environment with support and mentoring from Employment Coaches and Production Team Leaders.

Employment opportunities include:

- Food packaging
- General packaging
- Equipment operations
- Clean room packaging
- Document destruction
- Recycling
- Printing, mailing and collating
- Commercial cooking (Kingaroy only)

Mainstream employment

If you want to increase your independence, earn your own money and connect with the community, mainstream employment might be the right option for you.

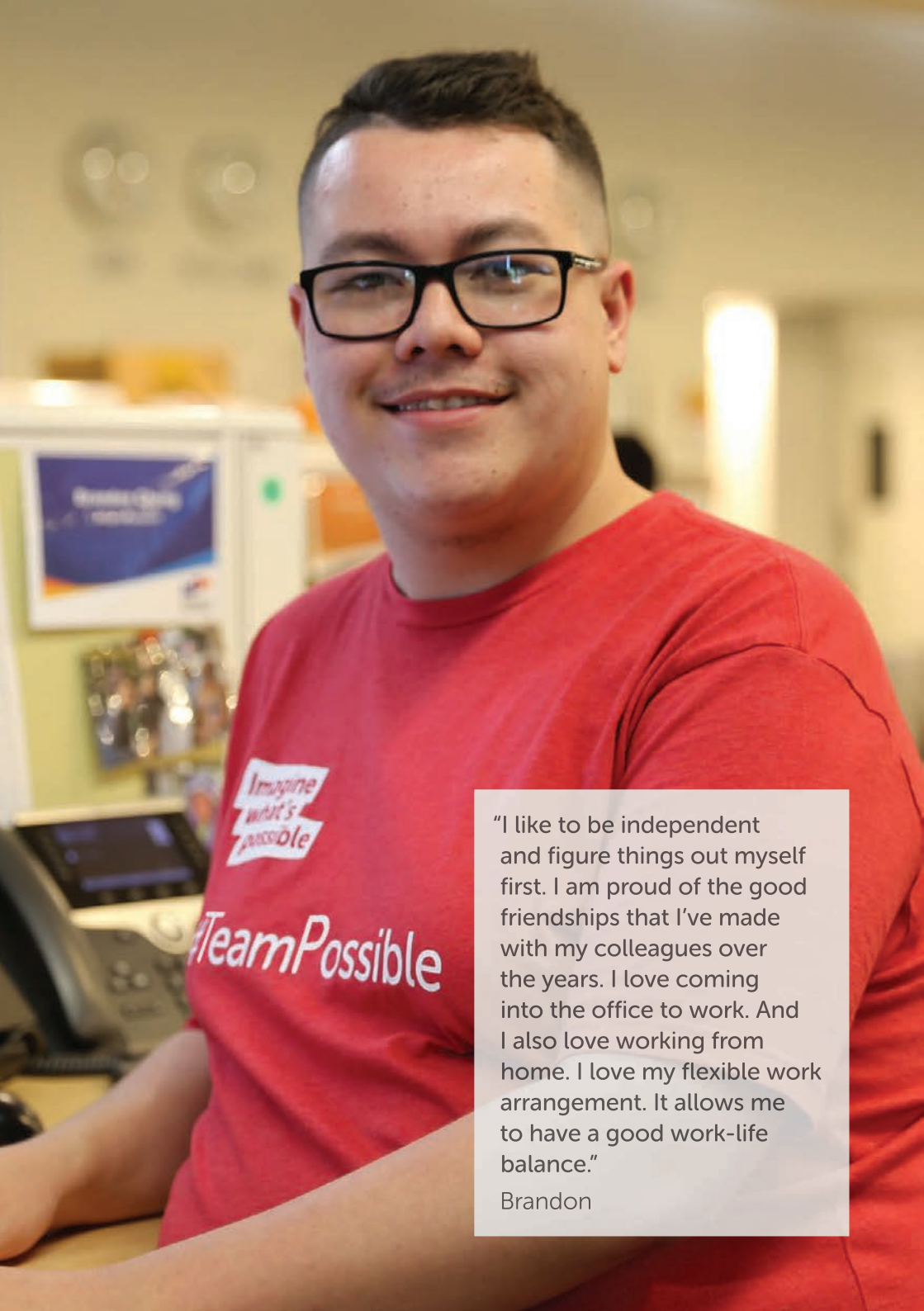
In mainstream employment, you will be working with people without disability. You can work independently, anywhere you want, while earning your own money.

You do not have to transition to mainstream employment completely alone. We can help you get job ready and navigate life in mainstream employment. Support such as mentoring, training and ongoing support can help you achieve your work goals and feel comfortable in a mainstream work environment.

We work in partnership with Community Solutions Group, a Disability Employment Service (DES) provider who can help you find mainstream employment in Queensland and Victoria.

You'll benefit from:

- Career advice
- Assistance with preparing for work
- Help with resume writing and interview skills
- Referrals to personal and/or specialist support services
- Assistance with gaining new skills and/or qualifications
- Support once you get a job, including on-the job training

Defence Assistance Program

Working at an Australian Defence Force base is a unique opportunity. You will enable Australian Defence Force personnel to focus on the Defence mission of defending Australia.

You can undertake duties such as:

- catering
- records management
- cleaning
- setting up training rooms
- making welcome home banners
- coffee making
- shredding
- sorting, and collating mail
- facilitating BBQs
- and much more.

Endeavour Foundation is directly responsible for the Defence Assistance Program at ten Defence bases nationally. You can work on Australian Defence Force bases across Queensland, New South Wales, Northern Territory and Victoria.
